The National Council of Negro Women (NCNW) is an “Organization of Organizations” (comprised of 300 campus and community-based sections and 32 national women’s organizations) that enlightens, inspires and connects more than 2 million women and men.

NCNW’s mission is to lead, advocate for, and empower women of African descent, their families and communities.

The National Council of Negro Women, Inc. was founded in 1935 by Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, an influential educator and activist, and for more than fifty years, the iconic Dr. Dorothy Height was president. Dr. Johnnetta Betsch Cole was elected President of NCNW in 2018, ushering in a new era of social activism and continued progress and growth for the organization.



Today, NCNW’s programs are grounded on a foundation of critical concerns known as “Four for the Future”. NCNW promotes education with a special focus on science, technology, engineering and math; encourages entrepreneurship, financial literacy and economic stability; educates women about good health and HIV/AIDS and Covid-19; promotes civic engagement and advocates for sound public policy and social justice.
